My name is John Kinder Jr. and I have been fortunate enough to have played quarterback at the Division-1 level. I played under Doug Marrone (Jacksonville Jaguar Head Coach) at Syracuse University, where he assembled a coaching staff of former NFL coaches and some of the brightest minds in football in the country.
